


Kitazaki & Itoshima Area

An area where you can relax and enjoy the beautiful surrounding environment at one of Japan's 100 Great Beaches, and only about half an hour from the city center



Sakurai Futamigaura 2

Located in the northern part of Itoshima City, this is a beautiful scenic beach located within the Genkai Quasi-National Park. It is especially famous for its beautiful sunsets and a pair of similarly shaped rocks, called Meoto-iwa, or the married rocks. These rocks are part of Sakurai Shrine, a 5-minute drive away.




Angel Wings 2

There is a mural of angel wings just a short walk from Palm Beach Gardens, a commercial complex. It is a popular photo-op spot for the many visitors who come here to take a photo standing between the wings as if they were wearing them.



Palm Tree Swing 1

Located on the beach behind the fish restaurant, Zauo (Main Branch), this swing, hung between two palm trees, is a great place for taking photos. You can capture a postcard-perfect photo here with the beautiful blue ocean as a backdrop.



Raizan Sennyoji Daihioin Temple 2

This temple, founded by Seiga Shonin, an Indian Buddhist monk, once flourished as a prayer temple built on the orders of the emperor. More importantly, it played a key role as a prayer temple for the Kamakura Shogunate during the Mongol invasions of Japan.




Sakurai Shrine

This shrine, shrouded in a solemn and sacred atmosphere, was founded in the 17th century during the early Edo Period, and is well known for the deities it hosts: one who blesses new romantic relationships and another who wards off evil spirits. One of the highlights of the shrine are the colorfully painted carvings of the main hall.

Shiraito Falls 2

This beautiful waterfall, with fine threads of water cascading delicately down its rocky surface, is surrounded by stunning natural scenery, making it the perfect spot for a relaxing stroll.

Karatomari Ebisu Oyster ①

This species of oyster, cultivated in the calm waters of Hakata Bay, offers a somewhat elastic texture with a rich, milky flavor. You can try this local favorite fried over charcoal at one of the many oyster huts by the sea.

Do not take photos in no-photo areas.




Flush used toilet paper down the toilet.
