Hakata Area

Perfect for a break from strolling Hakata Old Town

The specialty here is the lunch box wrapped with a beautiful Hakata *obi* belt. The box is packed with a variety of items made from seasonal ingredients.

Souvenirs

Japanese Goods

There are a variety of souvenirs to purchase, such as clothing, daily items, and ornaments, with unique Fukuoka-original designs.



Cotton-padded Hanten Jackets
These are warm, casual-style Japanese traditional jackets.



Fukuoka Goods
Some cool items are available embroidered with kanji or hiragana characters. There are also happi coats designed for pets.

Hakata Ohajiki
These ohajiki pieces are made individually by hand, and considered good luck charms.



Others

There are a number of other Fukuoka originals here, such as the Gundam plastic model kit only available in Fukuoka, Penco notebooks manufactured by a local stationery company, wooden toys made from Fukuoka trees, and sake produced by local breweries.



Traditional Crafts

Hakata's traditional crafts have been preserved for several hundreds of years, and are still manufactured using the same traditional methods by skilled artisans in Hakata.

Hakata Dolls

Women in kimono and warlords are well known subjects for Hakata dolls, but there are also some featuring animals and children.



Fukukaburi Neko
This is the new version of the cat-shaped Hakata doll designed as good luck charms.

Hakata-ori Textiles

There are a wide variety of items to choose from, such as purses and even authentic obi belts.



Hakata Magemono

This fine craftwork is created by bending wood, such as cedar and cypress, into shape without the use of metal parts.



Visitor Etiquette
